4.2 Written Communications:

Anne Thomas received a text from a site teacher requesting that she ask the direct question: Is the site program going to be closed. The discussion and ensuing answer was that it is the desire of ARCS administration and BOMUSD Staff to keep the ARCS Site Program viable and sustainable. The practical matter of creating a balanced budget with the current enrollment of 83 students in the

site program as we anticipate deep cuts at every level of the education system will be the challenge for this upcoming year and potentially many years to come.

5.2 **Teacher's reports - Site:**

Anne Thomas

Anne Thomas reported that based on teacher discussion all site teachers are working hard to meet student needs during this challenging circumstance. Some teachers are more comfortable with the distance learning model than others, but all are finding ways to connect with their students and families as we navigate this unchartered territory. Abbygail Creiglow shared that from her perspective as a parent, all 3 of her children's teachers were very successfully providing her family with what they needed to learn at home.

Penny Howell shared that things are going well in the Homeschool arena as well. In her case, her daughter has actually had more time for her studies as she is not involved in social activities due to the Shelter-In-Place orders.

5.3 **Financial Report:**

Laura Moneypenny

Laura Moneypenny shared that she is working closely with Sid and others to gather all necessary information to assist with creating a balanced budget for the 20-21 school year. Currently, the district does not have all of the information needed. The district is awaiting news from the Governor's Office as well as the EDCOE as to the degree of cuts that will affect our budgets. It is projected that schools will sustain anywhere from 3%-25% cuts to their funding. Experts are leaning toward the higher number. In our district that could mean 2-5 million in deficit. Our school may suffer as much as \$250,000-\$500,000 loss. We are in a crisis situation.

5.4 **Director's Report:**

David Gleason

David Gleason reported that we need to view our situation for next year and going forward through a financial lens. Our decisions will be based on simple math. The enrollment in our programs and the funding available will determine what we can reasonably do. We are required to present a balanced budget and financially feasible plans to BOMUSD as they will not approve anything less. Additionally, we are now required to submit our school budget to EDCOE for approval as well. Dave and Laura will attend a School Services meeting at EDCOE on 5/19.

- 6.3 **ARCS programs review**: We currently have 83 students enrolled in the Site Program for Fall and 159 in the Homeschool Program. We are in a declining enrollment district. The low enrollment in the Site Program coupled with deep budget cuts statewide will force some difficult decisions to be made this year. We will need to come up with a scenario that enables us to balance the budget. We will know more after the Governor's message. We do not have firm numbers to work with yet.
